COMMUNITY WORKSHOP Social Emotional Wellness in Early Childhood: The Meaning Behind the Behaviour

Over the past ten years, she has supported hundreds of parents as they have learned to coach the healthy development of social-emotional skills in their children. Dedicated to better understanding the needs of young children, Shelly is interested in developing strategies for caregivers and children to address struggles they experience in their lives. Shelly has created the Therapeutic Kindergarten Readiness Program, a local initiative that promotes healthy skill development.
